The Origins and Evolution of the DASH7 Alliance™

ISO 18000 - 7 Standard Testing Expert

The origins of the DASH7 Alliance™ and its evolution to date will be discussed. ISO 18000-7 is the ISO standard for active RFID systems operating at 433 MHz. Sparked by a meeting hosted by the University of Pittsburgh RFID Center of Excellence in March 2008 bringing together ISO 18000-7 stakeholders to discuss issues and concerns with the existing ISO 18000-7 standard the need for cooperation became apparent. Following this seminal meeting, key entities began to discuss the formation of a formal group to foster cooperation and innovation in active RFID, ISO 18000-7. Late in 2008 preliminary agreements were reached to move forward with the formation of the DASH7 Alliance™ and a planning meeting was held in February 2009. This presentation will trace the evolution of the DASH7 Alliance™ from that meeting in March 2008 to the present day and will highlight some of the challenges that the DASH7 Alliance™ is addressing.
